The STEM Camp, taught by Suzette Martin, a fifthgrade teacher at Lewis, was held at Lewis School Aug, 8 The camp was offered to girls as a way of bolstering their interest in the STEM fields.

The subject matter focused on renewable energy, specifically solar energy. The 18 camp attendees designed and built solar-powered boats to move and carry various objects.

The girls also collected water from local waterways and examined it for life under the microscope.

A deep sea cruise was scheduled to give the budding scientists the opportunity to
